Recruitment Script for clinical supervisor initial contact with eligible mother:

“Hello, (eligible mother’s name), my name is _____, and I’m a clinical supervisor for the University of Washington Parent-Child Assistance Program, or “PCAP”. (Name of referral source) gave me your name as someone who might be interested in being in PCAP. I’d like to take a few minutes to tell you about the PCAP study, answer any questions you might have, and see if you might be interested. Is this a good time for you?”

The University of Washington is conducting a study to learn how three years of help from a case manager may help mothers and their families. We want to know if the program helps them become healthy and alcohol and drug free.

If you take part in the study, we would interview you when you enroll into PCAP, and a UW researcher would interview you again in three years. We would do the interview in person if possible, or via Zoom video or phone. We would ask questions about your drug and alcohol use, your pregnancies, your criminal history and your family history. I would ask you about your mental health. The interviews take about two hours.

You do not have to be in this study if you don’t want to. You can get PCAP services even if you don’t want to be in the study. If you participate, you don’t have to answer every question. The UW research team would pay you \$20 or give you a \$20 gift card for the three-year interview.

Do you have any questions about the research?”

If the eligible mother is not interested:

“I understand. Thank you for your time.”
